

Over FiveMillion Americans Have Alzheimer's Disease

Gerald Godette had the program last week. His guest speaker was Norman Rogers who spoke on Alzheimer's disease. Alzheimer's disease (AD), is known as the most common form of dementia. There is no cure for the disease, which worsens as it progresses, and eventually leads to death. It was first described by German psychiatrist and neuropathologist Alois Alzheimer in 1906 and was named after him. As the disease advances, symptoms can include confusion, irritability, aggression, mood swings, trouble with language, and longterm memory loss. As sufferers decline they often withdraw from family and society. Gradually, bodily functions are lost, ultimately leading to death. Since the disease is different for each individual, predicting how it will affect each person is difficult.


According to Norman, over 5.5 million Americans have AD. It is the number 3 killing disease today. It is the only major disease whose death rate has increased over the past 10 years. All other diseases death rates have gone down. There are no drugs on the market that will cure AD or even slow it down.

Norman is a spokesman for C.A.R.T .-- a volunteer organization that raises money to provide research into the causes of AD. Norman said if every Rotarian in all Districts gave just .25 weekly, C.A.R.T. could raise \$445,000 annualy to fight AD.

ROTARY DONATES \$250 TO HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

Last week the Rotary Board of Directors voted to donate \$250 to Habitat for Humanity.

Rotarians who were members of the club in the mi-80s will recall that the Morehead City Rotary Club helped Habitat construct a home near Cape Lookout High School. The home cost \$30,000 and was funded from donations from all Rotary Clubs in the County. West Carteret High School carpentry students built the house over a two year period.
