## Les Vingt Femmes Motivates Young Women to Participate in Civic Activities

Herb Phillips had the program last week. His guest speaker was Ms. Hannah Tootle, President of Les Vingt Femmes—a women's business and professional organization. The club was named by a French teacher at West Queen Street High School. It means "Twenty Women."

The club's major efforts include introducing debutantes to society; extending educational opportunities for students in Carteret County; sponsoring social activities; providing financial support to persons in the community who have medical needs beyond their capacity to pay; participating in Black History Month; supporting the Broad Creek Clinic; participating in the Festival of Trees held each year at the Civic Center; and engaging in many fund raising activities to support the club's community projects.

Ms. Tootle said that Les Vingt Femmes gives 10 scholarships each year to students at West Carteret High School. But she said that she is most proud of the club's efforts to support Carteret General Hospital. Les Vingt Femmes has beautifully furnished a room at the hospital—a room that is warm and inviting to patients and helps take their minds off worries associated with being in a hospital. This in itself is a great comfort to many people.
