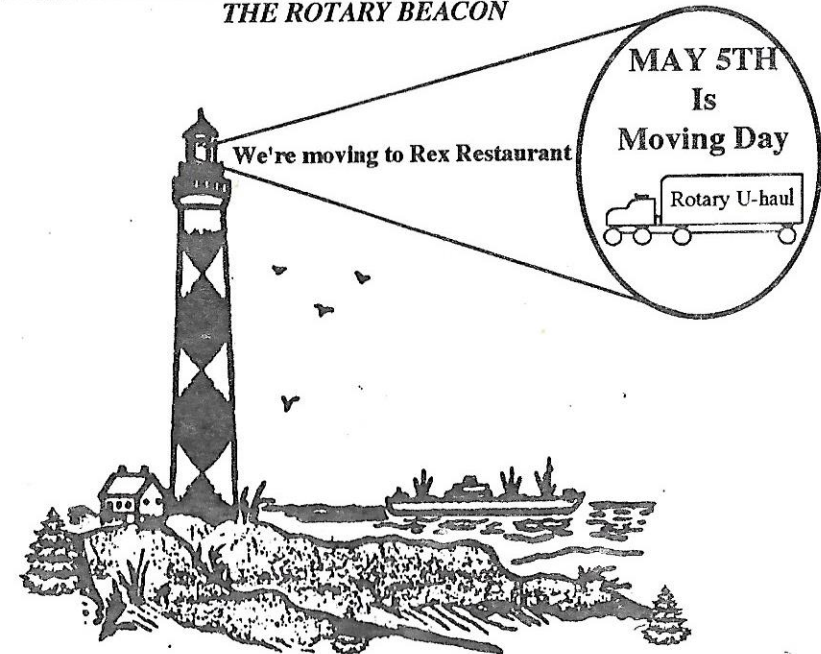

Basically we grow three crops--corn, soybeans, and wheat. We also experimented with cotton; but the ground was too wet. We also raise beef cattle.

We have plenty of wildlife on the farm. All kinds of water fowl as well as alligator, beaver, deer, otter, and black bear. You're welcome to visit anytime."

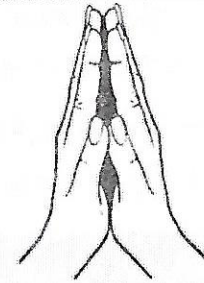

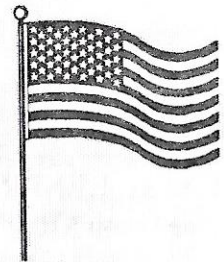

RUSS OUTLAW WORKS THE CROWD...

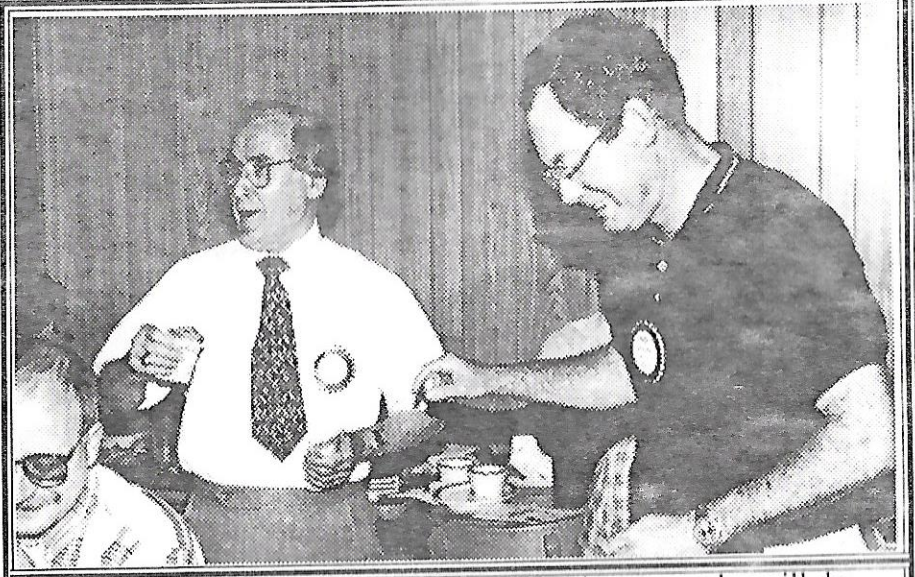

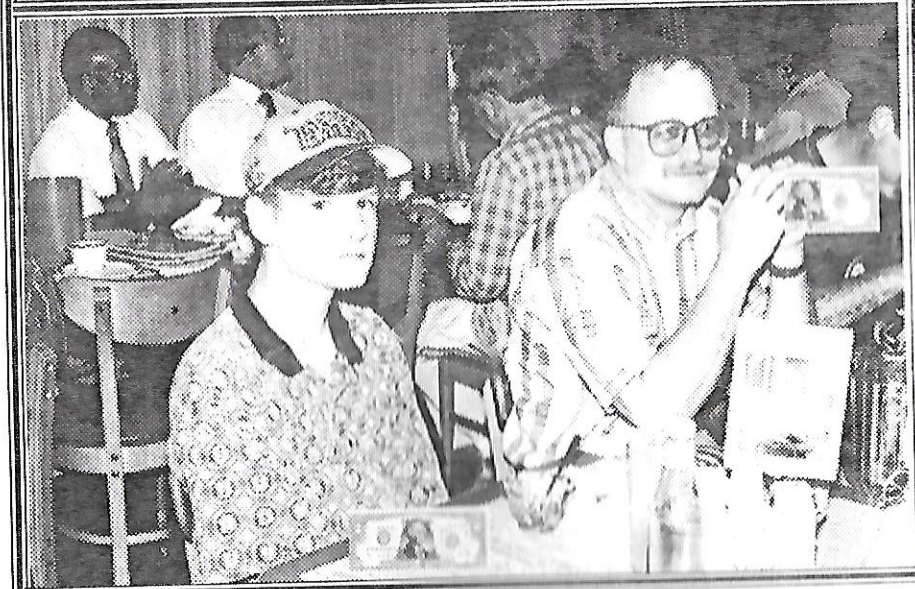

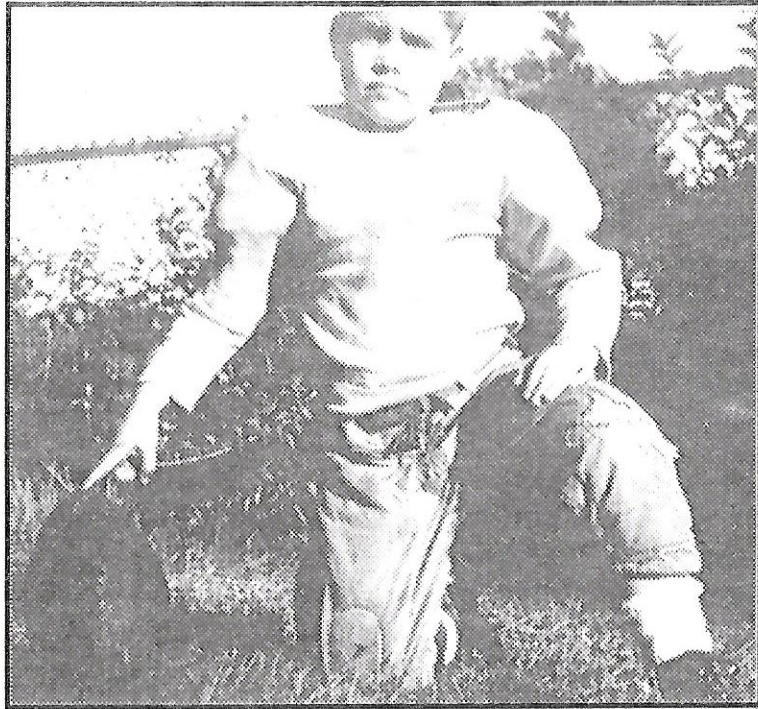

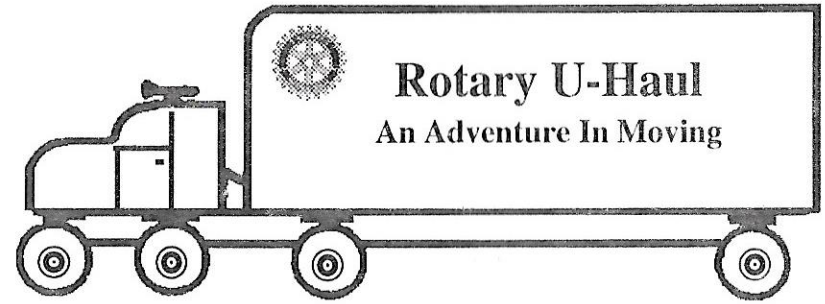
