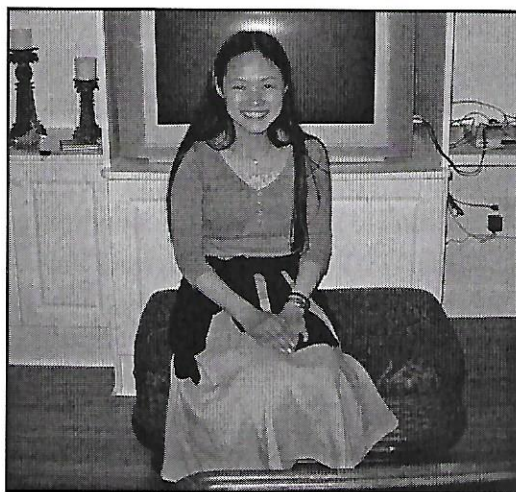

ago, Lee was a member of a team our district sent to Japan. Having been a member himself, he knows something of the language and the benefits of participating in the GSE program.

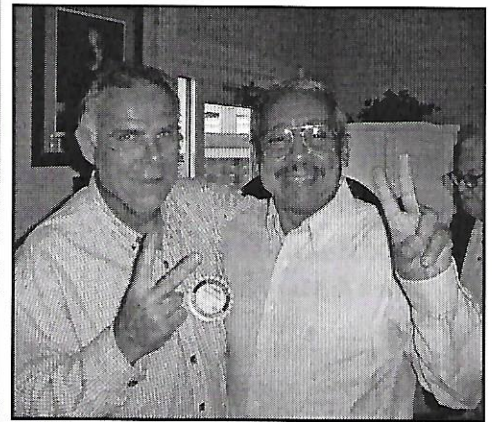

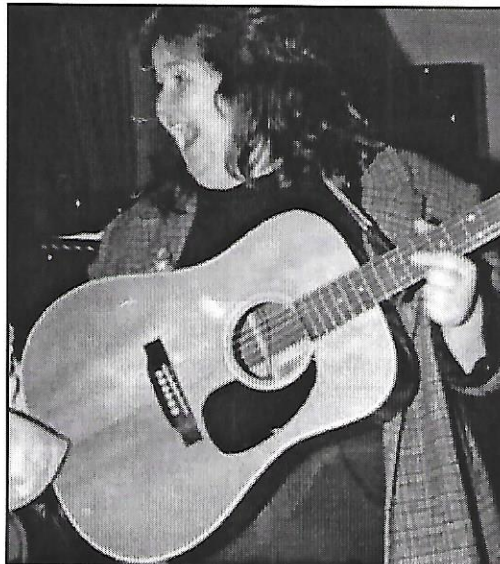

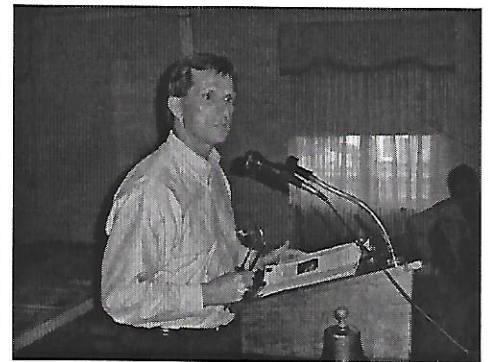

During these past eight decades, millions of young players have enjoyed playing baseball. The American Legion and their 2.8 million members have raised millions of dollars each year for players to learn the importance of teamwork, discipline, leadership and good sportsmanship. The American Legion sponsors American Legion Baseball to give players an opportunity to develop their skills, personal fitness, leadership qualities and to have fun."

American Legion Code of Sportsmanship stated below is simple and to the point: It reads: **I will:**

Keep the Rules; Keep Faith with my teammates; Keep my temper; Keep myself fit; Keep a Stout heart in defeat; Keep my pride under control in victory; Keep a sound soul; A clean mind; And a Healthy body
