

Bill Ward Performs Feats Of Magic with Cards and Scarves

Card manipulation (or card magic) is the illusion of magic using a deck of playing cards. Card magic is commonplace in magic performances, especially in close up magic or parlor magic and street magic. Good card tricks require sleights of hand. Some important sleights are double lifting, fake shuffling, card forcing, palming, back palming, multiple card control, card peek, classic pass, card change and a whole lot of other sleights.

Bill Ward seems to have mastered all the basic card techniques. During his magic act at last week's meeting, Bill mesmerized the club with a card trick that involved four participants. After several shufflings of partial decks, the participants--Bet Dowty, Jim Gar-

ner, Zack Phillips and Jim Phillips-stacked their mini-decks so all aces ended up on top without realizing themselves what they were doing. How was the trick done? It is a mystery only magicians know.

For his second trick, Bill pulled an infinite number of scarves from a seemingly empty container. Jim Gregson, Bill's assistant for this trick, seemed to be as mystified as the audience as to how the trick was accomplished. It was amazing to see scarf after scarf being pulled from an empty container. Like all good magicians, Bill offered no explanation on how the tricks were done. Isn't it strange that these tricks have been around for hundreds of years, but only a few people know how they are done?

Morehead Rotary Applies For Grant to Build Dog Park

The Morehead City Rotary Club will apply for a District Grant to help build the proposed dog park. District grants support short-term humanitarian projects that benefit the community. Grants are limited and must be matched dollar for dollar.

Dick Rogers, who will submit the proposal, said he had spoken to District Governor Lee Dixon and was told that grants in the amount of \$1,500 or more are available for such projects. Lee suggested Rotary Park as the best location since Rotary already has a strong commitment to expanding the park. He also thought that all clubs in the county should be involved in a community service project of this magnitude.
