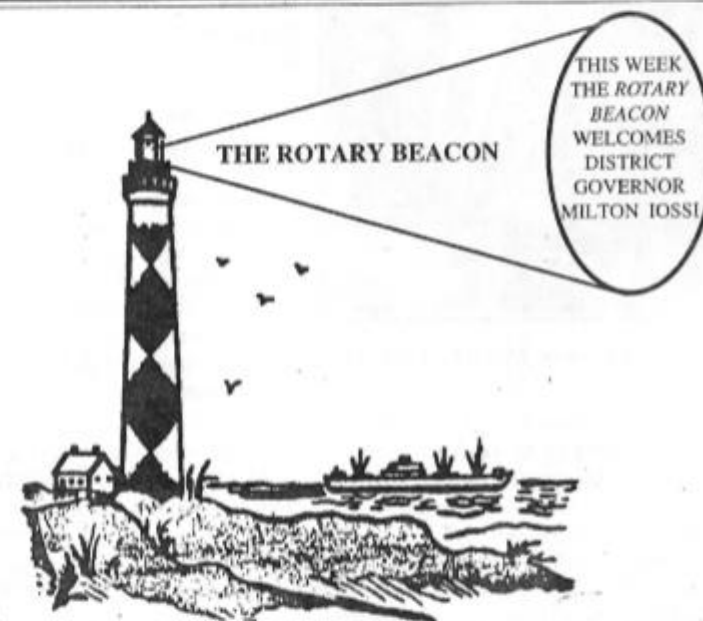

Rotary District 7730 Governor Milton Iossi joins us this evening. Milton lives in Shallotte where he is a charter member of the Rotary Club of South Brunswick Islands. He joined the club as a past service Rotarian in 1987 and served as president in 1990-1991. Milton was inducted as a Rotarian in 1983 by the Rotary Club of Dhaka, Bangladesh. His Current Classification is U.S. Foreign Service Officer (Retired).


Milton retired in 1985 as Counselor of Embassy of Public Affairs and Director of the U. S. Information Services in Bangladesh with a total of 30 years U.S. Government service, including more than 16 years abroad. He served in Eastern Europe, Western Europe, North Africa, South Asia and the Far East with interim tours of duty in Washington, DC. His fields of specialization include U. S. diplomatic service, public relations, information and cultural exchanges and overseas program management.

A native of Sioux Falls, South Dakota, Milton served with the U.S. Army Engineers in Korea during the Korean War. He majored in International Relations at the University of Minnesota, graduating magna cum laude and Phi Beta Kappa. He completed graduate studies in International Affairs at Princeton University and the National War College in Washington, DC.

Milton works as a literacy and English tutor with the Brunswick County Literacy Council and is a member of the VISTA Advisory Board. His hobbies include aviation, golf, reading and personal investments.

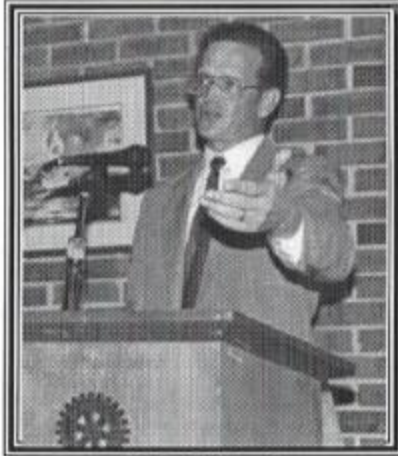

"Habitat", said Bob, "provides decent housing for families who cannot obtain home loans through traditional channels." Bob went on to say that land acquisition was the most serious obstacle facing Habitat in this county. In closing, Bob challenged the Rotary clubs of Carteret County to each contribute \$2,500 toward the construction of the next Habitat home in Carteret County.

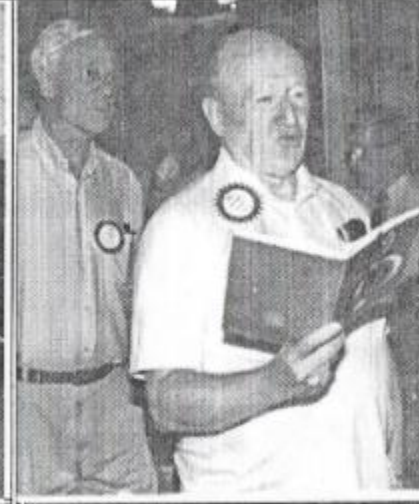

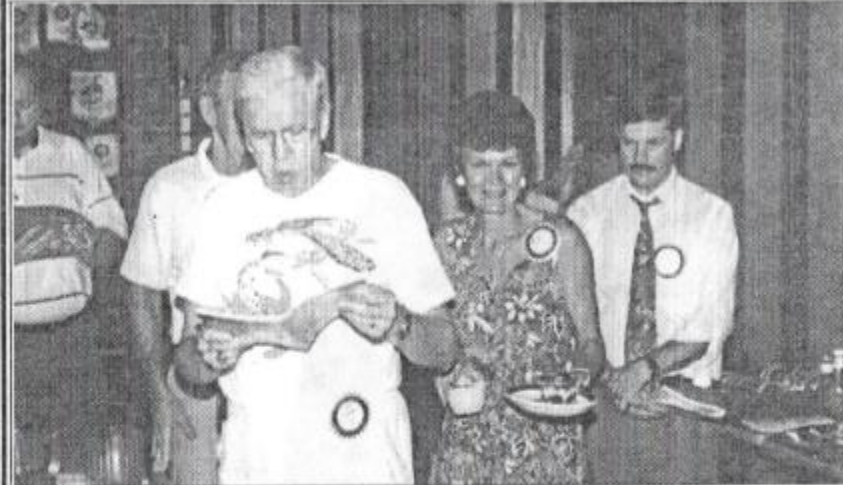
