

Streets Have Fascinating Names

Rodney Kemp Enthralls Club with History of Morehead City

In his inimitable style, Rodney Kemp told the Rotary Club how in the early 1850s, a group of investors known as the Shepard Point Land Company, purchased 600 acres of land on the eastern tip of the peninsula that is now the site of Morehead City. Their objective was to take advantage of the deep channel of Beaufort Inlet that led into Shepard Point to construct a port and connect it by rail to Goldsboro. Governor John Motley Morehead, for whom the town is named, a principal member of this group, initiated construction of the railroad in 1855 and by July 1858 rail service had been established. The town was laid out in city blocks, reaching to 15th Street, with a system of alleys within each block in the form of an H, so that all houses and businesses could be serviced from the alleys. Each block contained 16 lots and much of that "Philadelphia plan" still exists today. The town was officially incorporated by the North Carolina Senate in 1860, by which time the town's population had grown to more than 300.

It was also during the 1880s and 1890s that fishermen who had lived on Shackleford Banks moved their houses, many which still exist, by boat from the outer banks onto the mainland in the areas between 10th and 15th Streets, calling it the Promise Land.

One of the more interesting tidbits was the story of how Jib Street got its name. According to Rodney, part of the sound was filled in and the resulting piece of land resembled a sail, jib sail to be exact. The perfect name for a parcel of land adjoining the sea.


