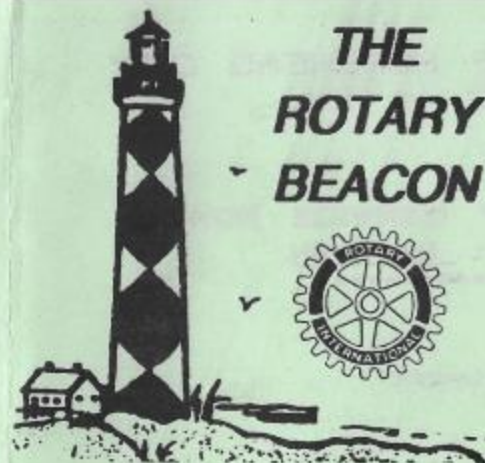

## Paul Harris Fellows: a mini-history

Within two years after Paul Harris died in 1947, fellow Rotarians contributed US\$1.3 million to The Rotary Foundation in honor of their founder. This amount was nearly twice as much as The Foundation had received over the previous 30 years. The donations provided the financial support that enabled The Foundation to grant 18 Graduate Scholarships—its first significant International Service program.

Today, those who continue the tradition of honoring Paul Harris by contributing US\$1,000—or for whom US\$1,000 is donated in their honor or memory—are designated Paul Harris Fellows.
