Carolina Student Transfer Excellence Program (C-STEP)

C-STEP now has nine community colleges across the state offering C-STEP. The Carolina Student Transfer Excellence Program (C-STEP for short) targets talented, low-to-moderate income students and provides them with opportunities to excel at the community college for two years and follow up with two years at UNC-CH. Admission to Carolina is guaranteed to these students two years in advance if they complete an AA or AS degree with at least a 3.2 GPA and fulfill certain program requirements. C-STEP students participate in cultural, social, leadership, and academic activities along with intensive advising. All of these activities at a community college are designed to ready them for transferring to Carolina.
