# Doris Wade, Coordinator for Christmas Cheer Assigns Family to Morehead City Rotary Club

Doris Wade who is in charge of the Christmas Cheer Program for First United Methodist Church said Christmas Cheer is an outreach service to the residents of Carteret County who are experiencing financial need around Christmas time, and are unable to provide Christmas presents, food, and other needs for family members for the celebration of Christmas.

The needs in Carteret County for the services provided by Project Christmas Cheer expanded over the years to the point when it outgrew what could be provided through the office of the Carteret County Department of Social Services. It was at that point that the churches stepped in to help.

Project Christmas Cheer is currently comprised of a Board of Directors, Coordinator, Assistant Coordinator and approximately thirty (30) volunteers. Applications are taken at three area churches for six weeks beginning in October 29 and ending in early December.

Project Christmas Cheer takes applications from all who apply. The applications are screened and must meet all applicable guidelines before they can be adopted by families who wish to provide Christmas to a deserving family.

Many of the Carteret County churches assist Project Christmas Cheer by donations to pay administrative expenses as well as adopting as few as five (5) families to fifty (50) families.

Captain Bill's of Morehead City adopts three hundred (300) children. Their names are placed on an Angel Tree and patrons of Captain Bill's may adopt as many angels as they wish.

Doris has matched the Morehead City Rotary Club with a family of four--a mother age 32, two daughters ages 3 & 8, and a son age 9. Their list of wants include clothes, bicycle, play station, Christmas music, dolls, art supplies and games.




## Rotary will partner with PAWS to build dog park

After more than six months of searching for land for a dog park, a site has finally been located. Provided the board of directors agree, the park will be located at 5042 Mattie Drive off Gloria Dawn Road in Morehead City. This site will be the new location for PAWS. The area set aside for the park is roughly 3/4 acre. The remainder of the tract will be used for a 12,000 square-foot facility which will house a shelter for adoptable rescued animals, a hydrotherapy center and an administrative building. To celebrate the event, PAWS held an old fashioned covered-dish meal.

Originally it was thought that the park could be located within Rotary Park, but land was not available.
