## Wild Horses on Shackleford Banks Are A Unique Historical and Cultural Legacy

Sonny Geer had the program last week. His guest speaker was Carolyn Frances Salter Mason. In discussing the horses of Shackleford Banks, Carolyn said the horses descended from a core group of Spanish horses about 400 years ago and that they were a unique historical and cultural legacy for the county. Oral histories and tradition handed down from generation to generation by coastal people say the horses have always been here...and that they came ashore from sinking Spanish ships.

In her efforts to save the horses, Carolyn spearheaded the establishment of a 501 (c) (3) nonprofit organization whose purpose is to protect the wild horses for future generations to enjoy, "We were so lucky in our efforts to get legislation passed to protect them. It seemed as if all the stars were in alignment. Everyone who could help was there when we needed support. It was truly amazing the way obstacles seemed to magically disappear. The horses were saved from extinction."

#### TONIGHT'S SPEAKER

Dave Lindsay has the program tonight. His guest speaker is Carl Tilgman, Tax Administer for the County. Tonight Carl will address the new tax evaluation. The county is conducting informal appeals now, where property owners meet with appraisers to review the value and work to reach an agreement. If an agreement is not reached, appeals can be heard by the Board of Equalization and Review, which is expected to convene in mid-April.

Property owners can appeal until the Board of Equalization closes but they are encouraged to do so as soon as possible so reviews can be completed before the board begins to meet.

The numbers will probably change as the appeals process takes place for taxpayers who contest their valuation. In his talk tonight, Carl will answer questions related to the process.


