

**SELECTION PROCEDURE
ROTARIAN-OF-THE-YEAR AWARD
MOREHEAD CITY EVENING ROTARY CLUB**

Eligibility

Any member in good standing shall be eligible for the award. (Having once received the award does not preclude a Rotarian from receiving the award more than once.)

Method of Nomination

any member of the club may nominate an eligible member for the award by completing a Rotarian-of-the-Year nomination form. *Nomination must be received by the selection committee by the last Thursday in May.*

Selection of Award Recipient

The president of the Morehead City Evening Rotary Club shall appoint a selection committee of three judges to evaluate candidates nominated for the award. The judges shall evaluate the candidates on the following criteria adopted by the board of directors.

- Participation in meetings, conferences, etc...
- Attendance
- Fellowship
- Committee assignments
- Community and civic involvement
- Professional activities
- Sponsorship of new members
- Fund-raising activities
- Miscellaneous contributions to Rotary

Presentation of Award

The recipient for the Rotarian-of-the-Year award shall be announced on the last Thursday in June during the Installation of New Officers Meeting.
