

Mayor Says Morehead City On Sound Footing
Jim Gregson's guest speaker last week was Gerald A. "Jerry" Jones, Jr. Jerry was elected Mayor of Morehead City in November, 1999. Prior to his Mayoral election Mayor Jones served as a member of the Morehead City Council for four (4) years. He was recently re-elected to his fifth 2 -year term. He is a native of Morehead City and is CEO of BJ Associates of Morehead City. Jerry talked about the current status of Morehead City and gave a brief overview of the city's plans for the future. He said Morehead City was on sound financial footing and would weather the recession.

service opportunities in Eastern North Carolina. While working to expand the reach and capabilities of HEPACO's Raleigh office Colin has managed over 100 emergency responses and scheduled projects, including one 4-month, multi-million dollar emergency response and clean-up.

Colin received his Bachelor of Science degree from the College of William and Mary. During that time he also worked in a molecular immunology lab, taught numerous Red Cross Health and Safety courses and volunteered as a firefighter/EMT. After working for two years as Director of Health and Safety Services for a Red Cross Chapter in southeast Virginia, he returned to academia where he attained a Master of Science degree in Safety with a concentration in Emergency Management from the University of Tennessee, Knoxville. While pursuing his graduate degree Colin interned in the environmental engineering department of a leading international auto parts manufacturer, supported the development of a county-wide all-hazard mitigation plan and worked as an assistant to the University's Radiation Safety Officer.

Colin has over 7 years of experience in the emergency management field. This experience includes Emergency Response, Emergency Planning, Hazardous Materials Handling, Exercise Coordination, Health & Safety Training, Emergency Medicine and Firefighting. He is experienced in a wide variety of contaminants and contaminated media associated with industrial, remediation, hazardous waste and other emergency response services.
