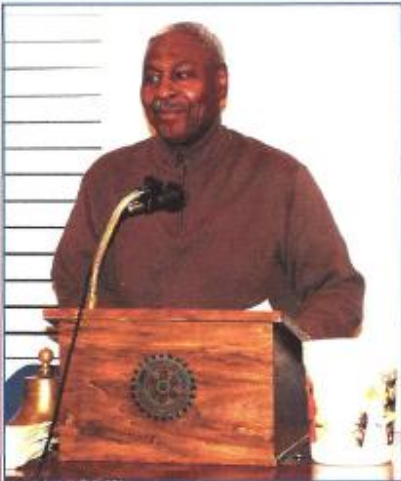

Three for the price of one

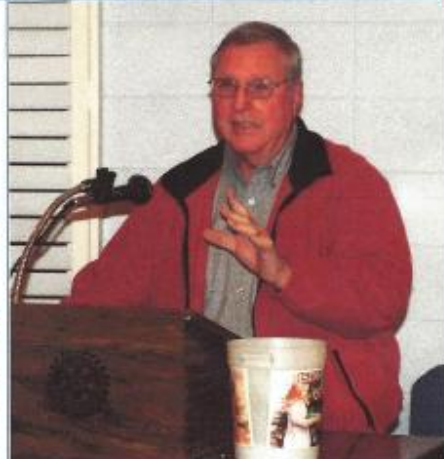
New Format for Rotary Program Provides Variety and Insight into Members Hobbies and Interests

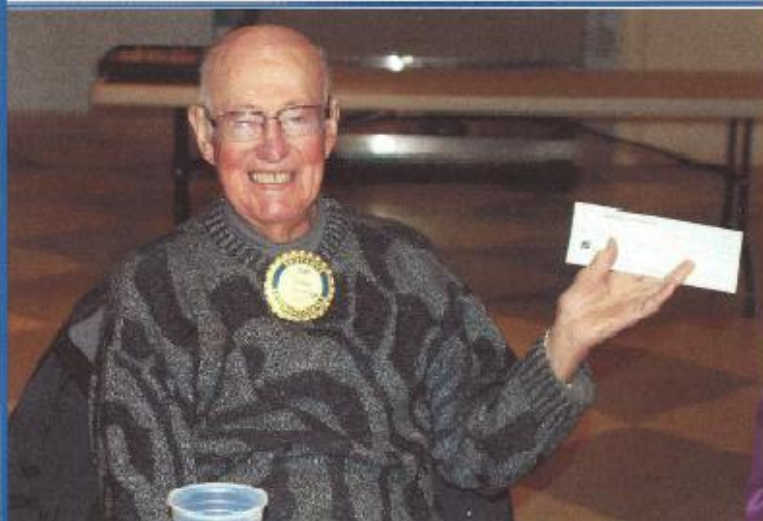

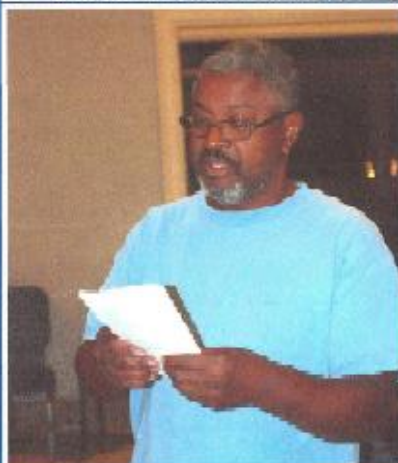
