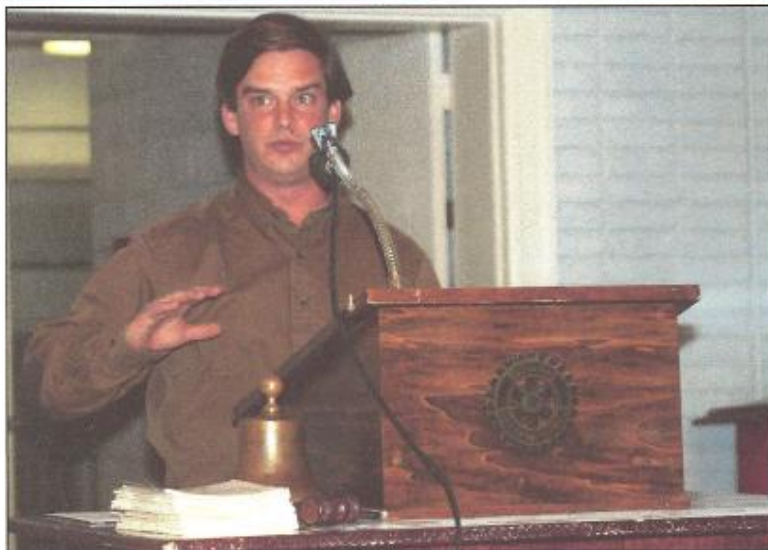

Shelby Freeman has the program tonight. His guest speaker is Col. Philip J. Zimmerman. He has served in all four of Cherry Point's EA-6B Prowler squadrons, and was recently appointed commanding officer of the Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point.

Zimmerman, a naval flight officer, transferred to the air station from his previous assignment as the chief of staff for 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing Forward, which is slated to go to Afghanistan in 2011. He served as an electronic counter measures officer on the Prowler and was also a flight instructor. He has been at Cherry Point on his current tour for 1 1/2 years. His new assignment is for three years.

Zimmerman was promoted to full colonel on Jan. 23, 2008. He was educated at Colorado State University prior to joining the Marine Corps.
