

Hazardous Management Expert Discusses Waste Clean-up and its Impact on the Environment

Sonny Geer had the program last week. His guest speaker was Colin Falato, project manager for HEPACO, a leading environmental, emergency response and domestic preparedness firm in the Eastern United States. Hazardous waste is a waste (usually a solid waste) that has the potential to cause, or significantly contribute to an increase in mortality (death) or an increase in serious irreversible, or incapacitating reversible illness; or pose a substantial (present or potential) hazard to human health or the environment when improperly treated, stored, transported, or disposed of, or otherwise managed. These wastes may be found in different physical states such as gaseous, liquids, or solids. Furthermore, a haz-

ardous waste is a special type of waste because it cannot be disposed of by common means like other by-products of our everyday lives. Depending on the physical state of the waste, treatment and solidification processes might be available.

Some hazardous waste generators are larger companies like chemical manufacturers, and oil refineries. During his talk, Colin talked at length about the crisis at the port last week. Luckily Colin and his team were on hand to help clean up the spill and prevent anyone from being injured or killed. What could have been a catastrophe was handled so efficiently that there were no injuries or fatalities. The community is grateful.
