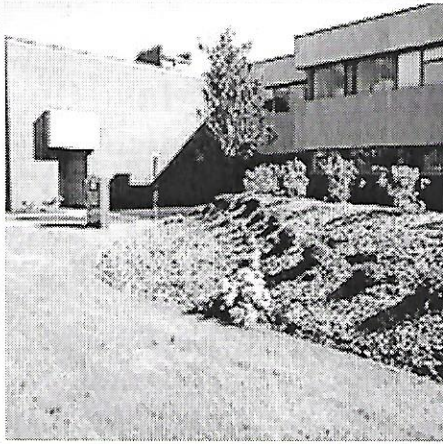
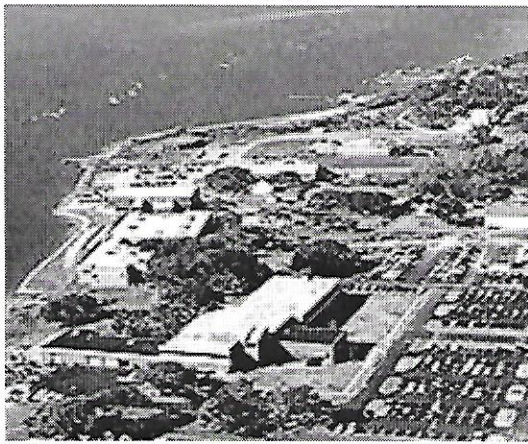

Tonight's Program

Dick Rogers has the program tonight. His guest speaker is Morgan Smith, public affairs director for Carteret Community College. Morgan joined the college in 1997 after a 20 year career as a Public Affairs Officer with the U.S.Navy.

During his time in the Navy, he rose to the rank of Commander, coordinating public affairs and news media projects around the world. During the early 1980s, he served as public affairs officer for the Blue Angels flight demonstration squadron.

While stationed in Washington, D.C., he earned a Master's Degree in Communication from the American University. Since joining the CCC team, Morgan has coordinated the college's public information program including advertising, news media, and community relations. He was part of a team that helped tell the CCC story during the campaign for the 2000 Community College Bond Referendum that won voter approval for \$15 million in new construction and renovation projects.
