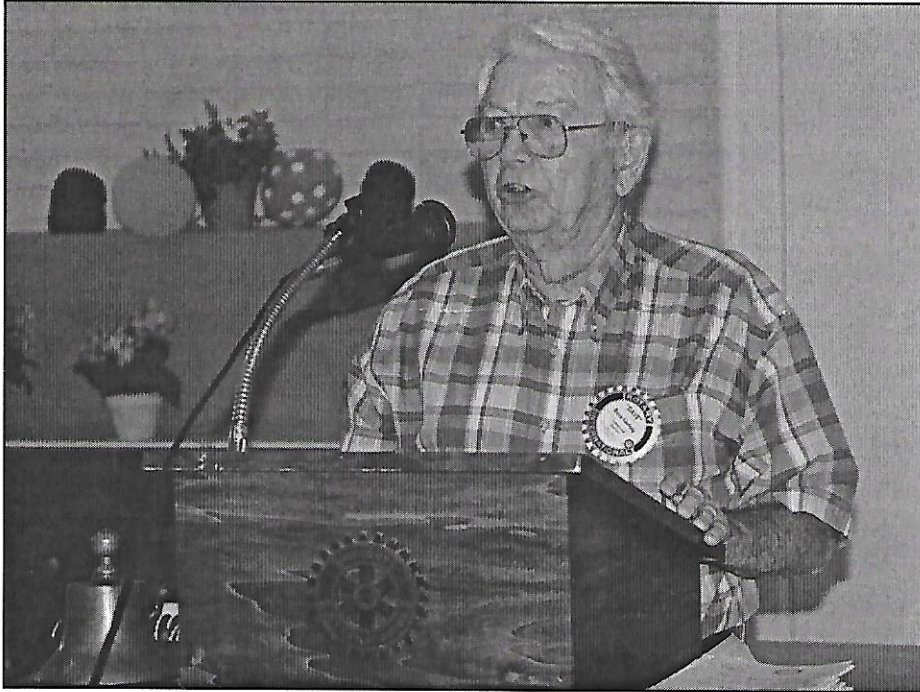

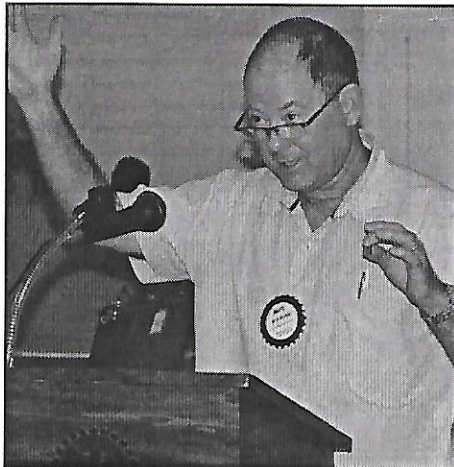

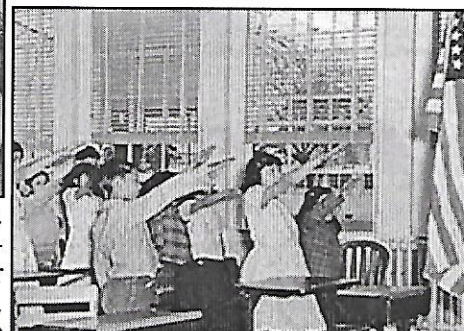


Dave Lindsay Getting the New Rotary Year Off to a Great Start

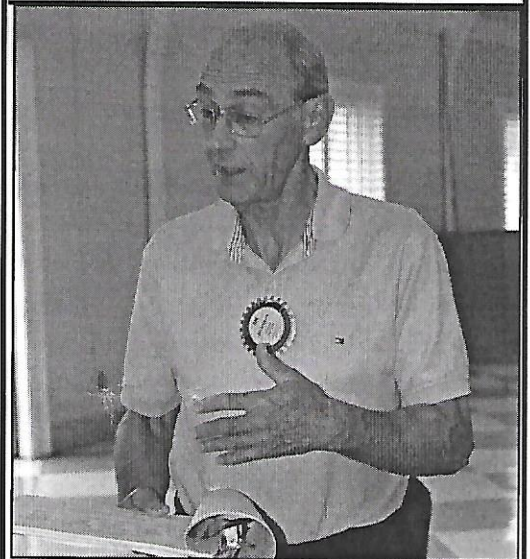
Flag salute prior to 1942

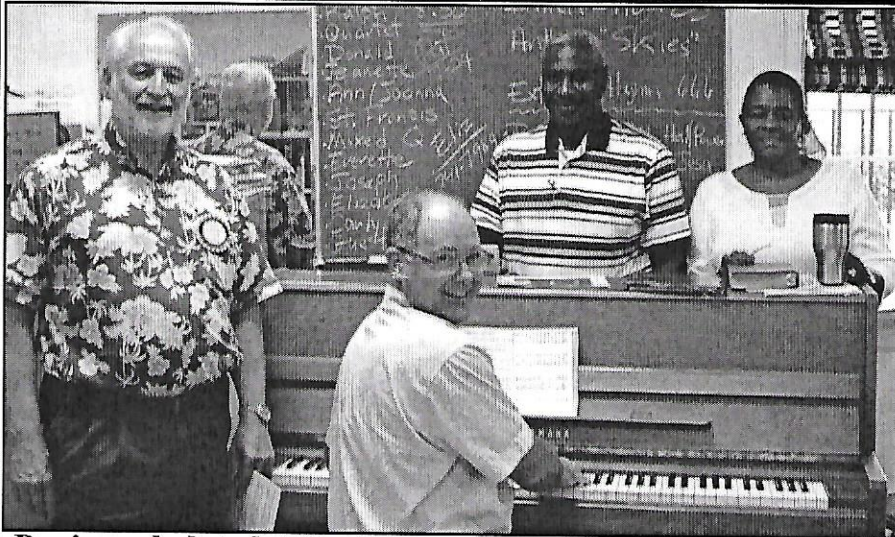
“I will not be with you tonight, but I have asked Stanley Harrell to handle the program for me. Good luck recruiting new members. We need them badly.”

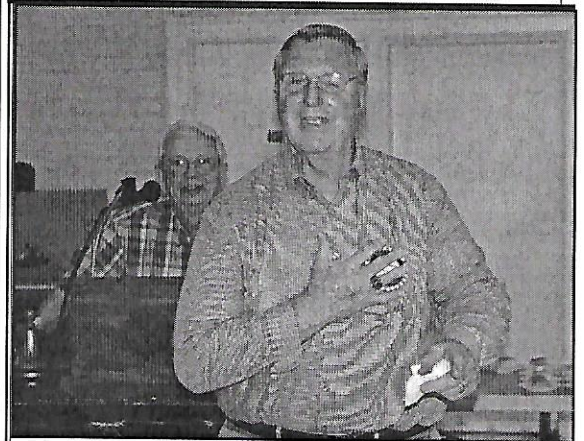
