

Jim Gregson (Right) introduced us to our newest Rotarian, Debra Whaley. Debra is an attorney and we're glad to have her join us.



# Things To Remember When Proposing A New Member:

Each active member shall be "a person of good character and good business or professional reputation and..."

- 1. MUST BE "engaged as proprietor, partner, corporate officer, or manager" or...
- 2. MUST BE "holding an important position in an executive capacity with discretionary authority" or...
- 3. MUST BE "acting as the local agent or branch representative"

A proposed member must be personally and actively engaged in a business or profession and his place of business or residence must be within the territorial limits of the club. There must also be an open classification for the proposed member unless it is an additional active member, which must be approved by the member holding that classification. There are some exceptions to this if the proposed member was a member, in good standing, with another Rotary Club.

IMPORTANT: It is extremely important for all parties involved that the proposed member's name be kept confidential prior to the permission given to submit the name of the proposed member to the club. ADDITIONALLY, the proposed member is not to know of the proposal until after approval by the Board of Directors
