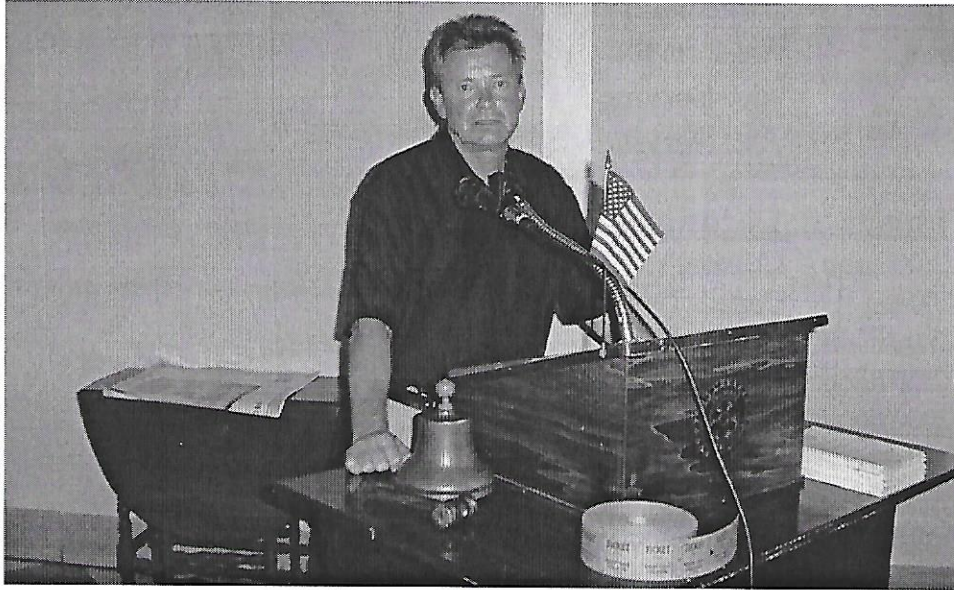

Larry Smith Discusses Procedures for Applying For Home Building Permits

Larry Smith, inspection supervisor for Carteret County and his inspections staff are responsible for issuing permits and completing building, electrical, mechanical, and plumbing inspections in accordance with the NC Building Code. The inspections staff is also responsible for local administration of CAMA, the Community Rating System (CRS), and FEMA regulations. The staff performs inspections of all public schools twice per year, and inspect mobile home and RV parks annually. In addition to unincorporated areas, the County also provides inspection services for the towns of Cedar Point, Cape Carteret, Peletier, Bogue, and Indian Beach. To obtain a building permit, follow the permit process outlined below:

1. Obtain an Authorization to Construct from the Environmental Health Department.
2. Complete CAMA permits if applicable and complete development application.
3. Submit a plot plan of your property showing where the structure will be placed and how many feet it will be from each property line.
4. Submit three (3) sets of plans to be approved and signed by the Building Inspector. This process could take up to three (3) days.
5. At the time the permit is written, the staff will need notarized statements from the contractor and any subcontractors stating they will be working on the project. The permit cannot be obtained without these statements.
6. When it is time for your inspections please call the Beaufort Office at 728-8545 or 393-3204/Cedar Point. Please have your permit number available.
