Private School Performs Better Than Public Schools on Tests

Stanley Harrell had the progam last week. His guest speaker was Jim Chalk who spoke about Gramercy Christain School--a school rooted in the belief that the basis of knowledge is faith in the Word of God.

"I have been involved with Gramercy since 1980," Jim said. "The school has the support of 40 local churches. We have an enrollment of 200 students in grades K-12. Our students come from all over the county. We graduate about 15 students each year. Our current budget is \$800,000 annually. The tuition ranges from \$3,000 for a kindergarten student to about \$4,500 for a high school student."


