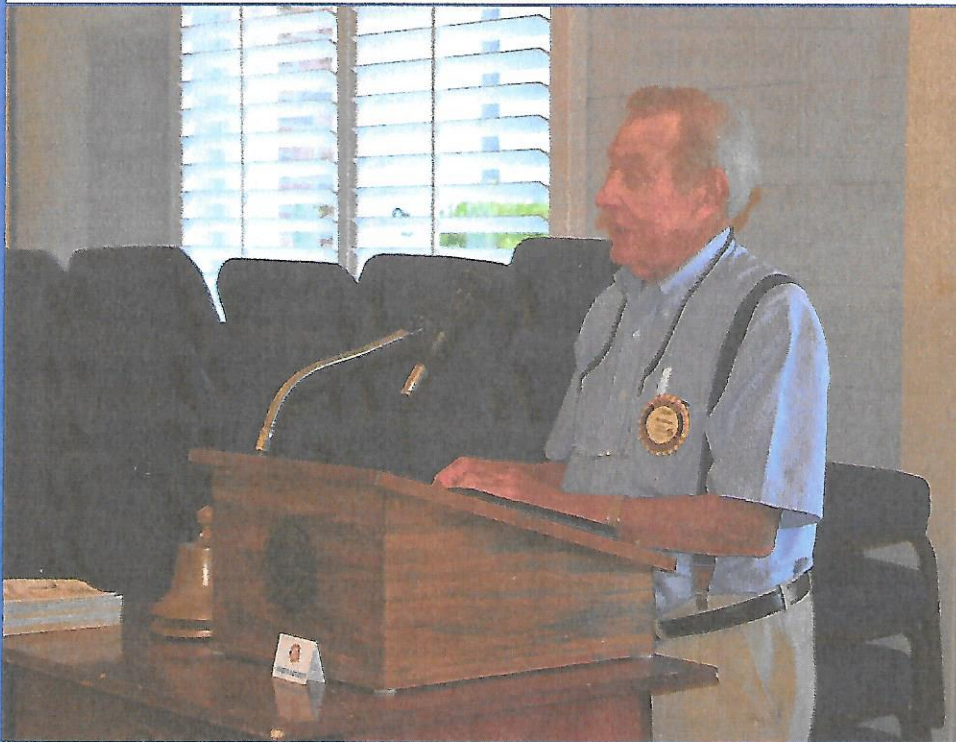

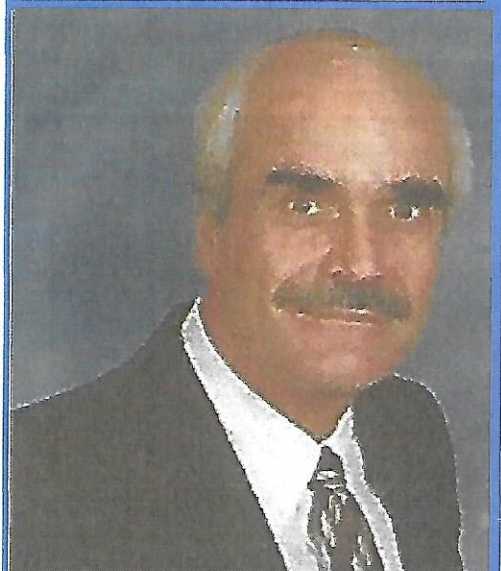

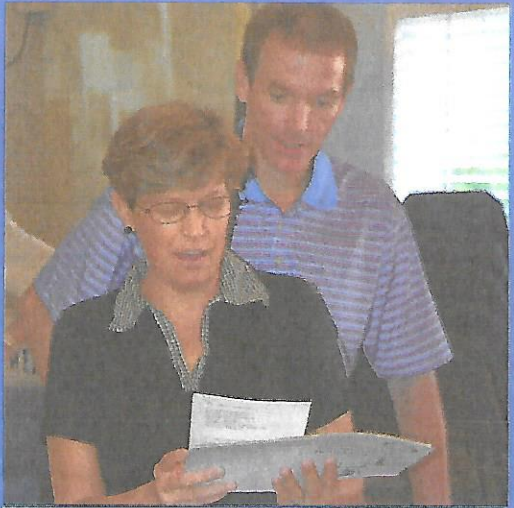


Dick Rogers has the program tonight. His speaker speaker is Brian Kraus. Brian has an interesting proposition to present to Rotary.

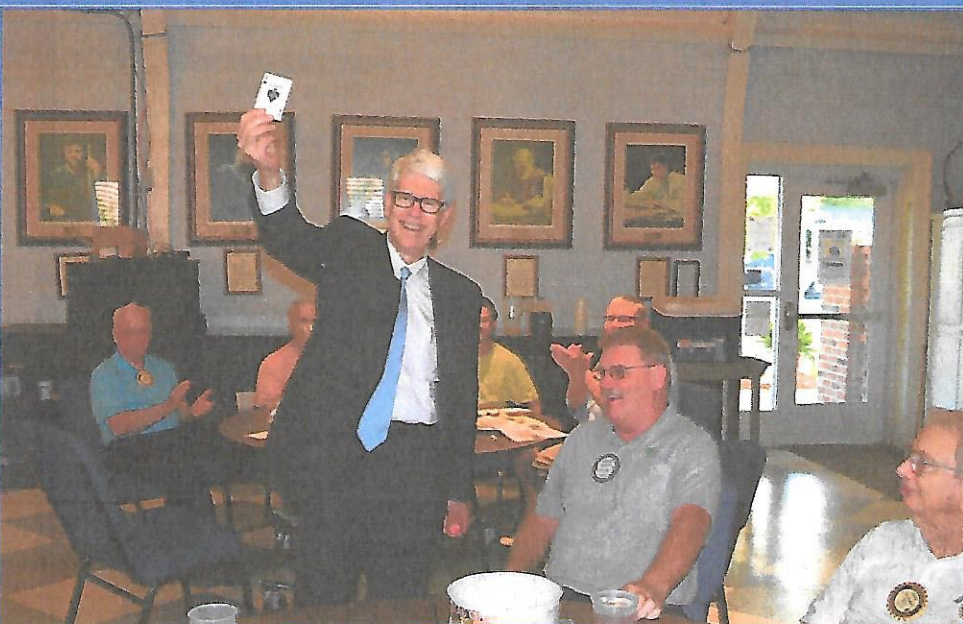
