

Second Toastmasters Club Organized


Steve Hellersperk Recounts Life As Power Plant Consultant Overseas

Dave Lindsay had the program last week. His guest speaker was Steve Hellersperk. Steve was born in Milenivek Poland on January 12, 1941. He came to the USA in 1945 and settled in Dallas, Pa. He received a BS in ME from Bucknell University in 1962 and shortly thereafter joined Foster Wheeler, a company that builds Boilers for Power Plants. He retired from Foster Wheeler in 2003 after 41 years of service. Most of Steve's time was spent working overseas principally in Spain, India, China, Kuwait and Iraq. He met and married wife Jacqueline in Baghdad, Iraq on June 2, 1966. Steve says his most fulfilling job was setting up grass roots offices in China, (1993-1998) and Chennai (Madras) India, 1998-2000.

Steve is also helping organize a second Toastmasters Club in Morehead City. Toastmasters is a nonprofit educational organization that operates clubs worldwide for the purpose of helping members improve their communication, public speaking and leadership skills. Through its thousands of member clubs, Toastmasters club adopts a "learn-by-doing" philosophy, wherein each member learns at a pace suitable to his or her developmental needs. The Toastmasters program is divided into two separate tracks, Communication and Leadership, with members progressing along each track by presenting speeches and taking on roles within their club, district, and Toastmasters International itself.



Installation Banquet Scheduled June 24th At Atlantic Beach Dunes Club


