



Artist Offers Rotary Club Unique Opportunity for Fundraiser

Dick Rogers had the program last week. His guest speaker was Brian Kraus, a local artist who specializes in producing paintings of the Civil War era. Brian has resolved to depict the battles of the Western theatre which are relatively ignored. The battles of North Carolina are of paramount importance to the artist. Brian is a member of the 1st N.C. Vols. /11th N.C. Troops; a Civil War Reenactment unit.

Brian has been producing limited edition prints of these famous battles since 2000 when his first print entitled "Bold Reconnaissance" was introduced.

In the past, Brian has offered his artistic talent as a means for Civic Clubs and other organizations to raise funds to support projects that strengthen the community. Brian said he would paint a scene that depicts some historical event in Carteret County such as the Battle of Fort Macon, Blackbeard's the Pirate's Exploits or perhaps the Queen Anne's Revenge. The painted image would then be transferred to a lithograph machine and a thousand copies would be printed. Rotary would pay for the cost of printing (approximately \$1,000) and sell the paintings to raise funds for the club. Brian's proposal will be discussed at the next board meeting and if approved, the board will decide on an historical scene for Brian to paint. The lithographs would be printed in early spring. A novel fundraising idea. Shall we chance it?
