Judge finds new career as standup comedian.

The Life of a Superior Court Judge: It Ain't Easy Dispensing Justice

Last week Rotary Club members got a rare glimpse into the life of Herb Phillips, retired Superior Court Judge. Herb gave a selfdeprecating speech heavily laden with humor and witticism. He began his autobiographical sketch with an incident that occurred in the first grade when he was accused of stealing a quarter from a classmate. He was falsely accused, of course, for how would it have looked for a future judge to commit a crime so early in life. After elementary and high school, Herb's enrolled at UNC-Chapel Hill. "Back in those day," Herb said, "the college-would admit anyone whose parents dropped him off on campus or somewhere in the vicinity." After graduating from law school, Herb returned to Morehead City to practice law under the tutelage and guidance of Luther Hamilton. After practicing law for a few years, Herb ran for District Court Judge. He said, "Only two votes were cast against me—one for Mickey Mouse and one for anyone but me. It was not long before Herb's talent for dispensing justice came to the attention of Governor Jim Hunt who appointed him to the Superior Court. After serving 26 years, Herb retired with the respect and approbation of friends and colleagues alike. It is said that judges don't age: time decorates them. Time has clothed Herb with wisdom and a deep sense of justice, tempered with compassion and mercy.


Take Me Out To The Ball Game
