Tammy Blizzard – Habitat for Humanity



The incoming Executive Director for Habitat for Humanity in Carteret County is a Rotarian in the Newport club. Crystal Coast Habitat for Humanity was founded in Carteret and Onslow Counties in 1976 with a mission to build strength, stability and self-reliance through shelter. To fulfil their mission, they build basic, quality 1,100–1,200 square foot, no-frills, homes for families who meet several qualifications: the family has a real need for housing, is

willing to partner with Habitat and demonstrates an ability to pay the mortgage. The lucky candidate puts sweat-equity into the home along side volunteers. Homes are built with donated money, labor and materials and are built when land and materials are available. Two homes are currently under construction: one each in Maysville and Jacksonville.

In addition to new homes, Habitat reconstructs home; two such homes are in process in Richlands and Smyrna. Habitat also has a repair program for "Aging in Place" where they build access ramps and install grab bars and zero-entry showers.

How can you help? Volunteer for home builds and repairs, work in the ReStores, volunteer for truck pick-ups and unloading. Recycle and Re-use.

2019 Man of the Year Rick Johnson

Our Man of the Year was one of a set of triplets born in Pennsylvania. Sadly, however, one of the babies did not survive. He and his remaining twin were Army brats and lived in many locations while growing up. When they were 13, they lived in Germany where Disney was shooting the movie Emil and the Detective. Disney needed twins for the part, and so we have a movie star among us!

He graduated from Montana State with a teaching degree in history and economics.

After college, he joined the Marine Corps where he achieved the rank of Lieutenant Colonel and eventually became Squadron Commander. He received recognition from VMAQ-2 for over 40 years of service to the EA6 Marine Electronic Warfare Community.



Our Man of the Year made his personal commitment to Christ as a youth in a small Baptist church where his mom played the organ. Since coming to FPC of Morehead City, he has served on Session and the Staff Support committee. He saw an opportunity for the church to obtain the land where Westminster Hall now sits. He was a driving force to ensure that this opportunity was not missed, even contacting Tim to discuss it before Tim had arrived here as our pastor. He also arranged the deal to purchase our first church van.

Our man of the year is definitely a leader but he is also a worker bee. For 26 years, he could be seen in the kitchen washing dishes for Christmas Cheer. He has been tireless in helping set up and take down the Nativity display every time that event has occurred.

He has always been a willing host for church gatherings, such as 20's-40's or the Boomer Bunch. Upon arriving home from the Persian Gulf War, he was surprised to find about 40 members of this church family in his brand new house.

But the church has not been the only recipient of this man's many talents. In the community, he has coached Little League baseball and basketball. He was a member of the Order of the Arrow and Scoutmaster for a troop of 80 boys and helped lead 16 of them to the rank of Eagle. Two years after he had left his position as scoutmaster, the troop was dissolving. This man's dedication to the program led him back to help the last six boys finish their Eagle requirements. He took boys to National Jamboree, Philmont, and too many hiking and camping trips to count.

The Rotary Club has also benefitted from his incredible organizational skills. He is a past president, and he received the 2018 District 7730 Rotary CART Volunteer Award for his work on Alzheimer's research and awareness, which raised over \$28,000 over three years. In 2019 he received the Club's Inspiration Award.
