SERVICE ABOVE SELF AWARD - 1992-93

Rotary International President, Cliff Dochterman, on behalf of the RI Board of Directors, announced that John T. Capps III is the recipient of a Service Above Self Award presented by Rotary International. This award was announced at the 84th. Rotary International Convention in Melbourne, Victoria, Australia, held 23-26 May, 1993.

The Service Above Self Award is the highest honor provided to a Rotarian by the international service organization.

John T., charter president of our club, is one of 91 Rotarians worldwide to receive the award, which recognizes individuals who embody, through their volunteer work, the Rotary motto of "Service Above Self." A maximum of 100 such awards are presented annually among the more than 1.1 million Rotarians in over 184 countries and geographical regions of the world.

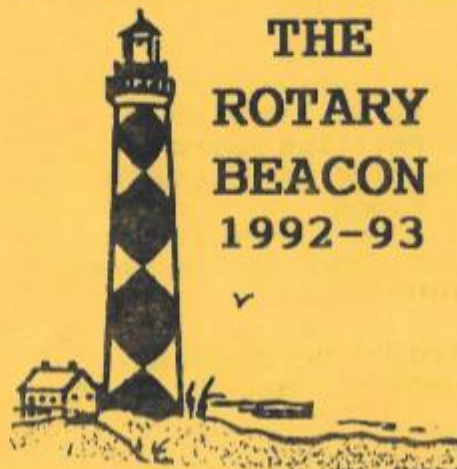
