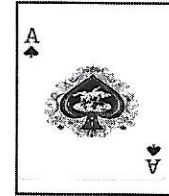
Mickey Moore Wins the Grill

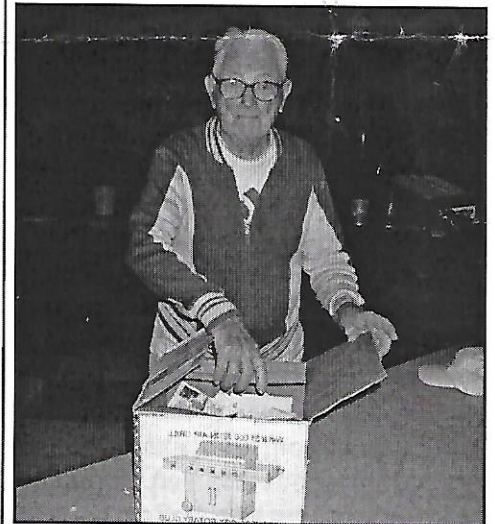
The Rotary Club congratulates Ms. Moore on her good fortune. May she never run out of propane gas in the midst of grilling T-bone steaks.

concerned?"

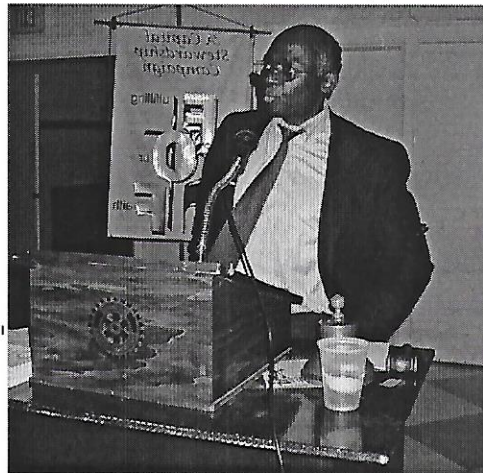

Dick Rogers has the program tonight. His guest speaker is Captain Mark Czanderna of the Salvation Army. Captain Czanderna will give us a brief report on the Christmas Bell Ringers' fund raising efforts and a general overview of what the Salvation Army does on an annual basis.

Salvation Army fund-raising campaigns are conducted on a local and regional basis. There is no fund-raising at the national level. The normal source of funds are the traditional Christmas kettle campaigns, direct-mail programs, corporate and foundation gifts, planned giving, and government contracts.

In most areas, The Salvation Army is a member agency of local affiliates of the United Way of America where such affiliation has proven to be beneficial to The Salvation Army. The organization's stewardship of its funding is noted throughout philanthropy; 83 cents of every dollar collected by the Army goes directly to client service...one of the highest percentages of any non-profit organization in the world.
