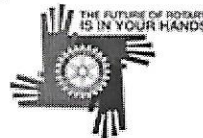

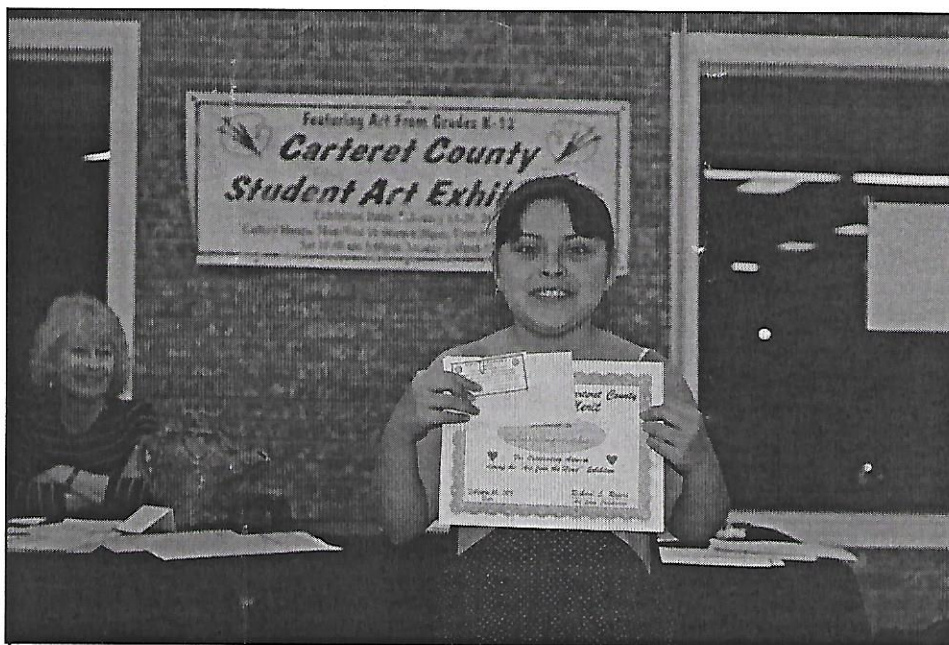


Andy Couch and Bill Frost Involve Student & Parents in Magic Show

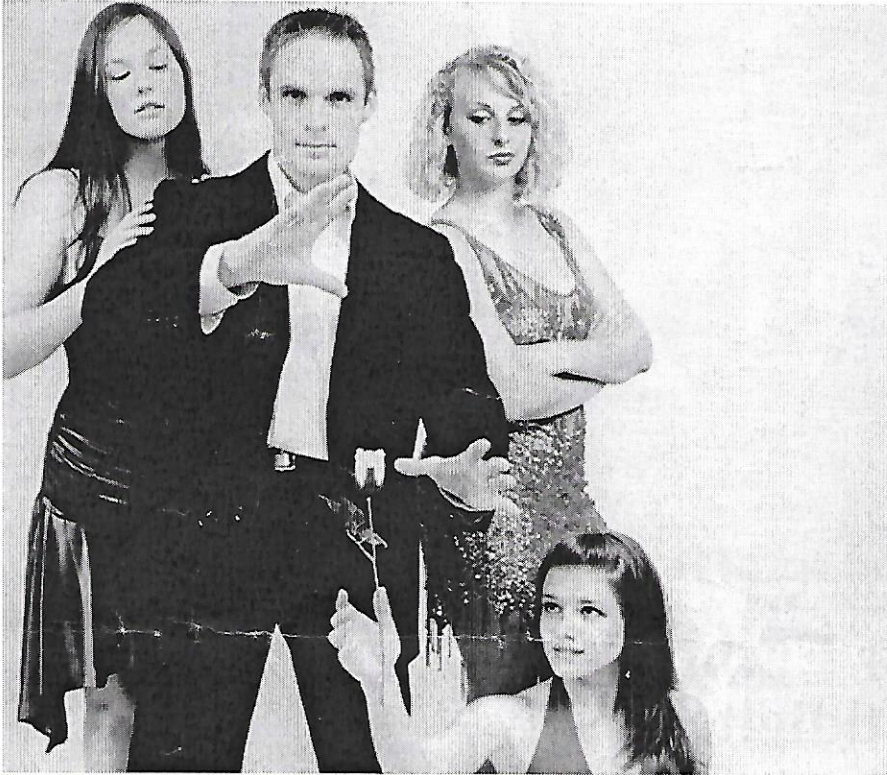

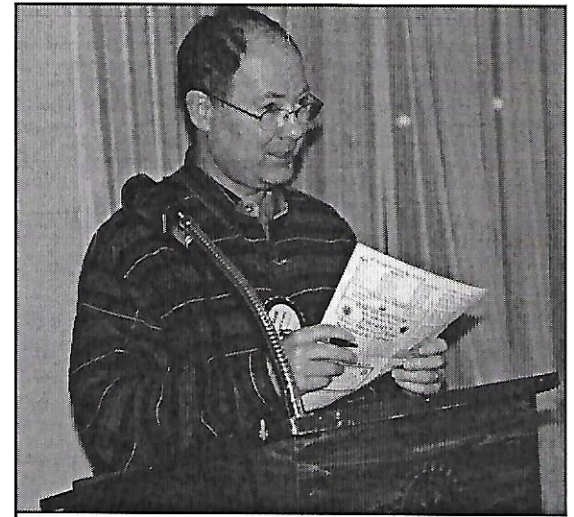


Magic Show Attracts Respectable Crowd
