Superintendent of Carteret County Public Schools To Speak Tonight



Brad Sneeden, Superintendent

Brad began serving the Carteret County Public Schools as superintendent on July 1, 2007.

Brad has been a teacher, assistant principal, principal, director of human resources for a private company, associate superintendent, superintendent, deputy state superintendent for the North Carolina State Board of Education, an adjunct professor, and a director in a university setting. His most recent position was Associate Vice President for the University of North Carolina System and the director of the Principals' Executive Program.

Brad has received recognition and awards throughout his career, including Teacher of the Year and Administrator of the Year in Craven County, Employee of the Year for Hatteras Yachts, Superintendent of the Year by two North Carolina educational organizations, and the James Batten Outstanding Educator from East Carolina University. In 2003, Governor Easley awarded Brad the Order of the Long Leaf Pine, which is the highest honor bestowed upon a citizen of North Carolina.

Brad is a nationally certified trainer in Interaction Associates', Facilitative Leadership and Stephen Covey's Seven Habits of Highly Effective People. He has also served on the board of directors for the National Malcolm Baldrige Association.

Brad and his wife Carolyn, a teacher, have two children. Olivia graduated from Meredith College and is planning to pursue a Physician Assistant's certification and Bradford graduated from NC State University and is preparing to enter dental school.



LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Shelby Freeman had the program last week. Shelby recounted his exploits as a B29 Bomber pilot flying air raids over Germany during WW II.

Shelby said he was just a young greenhorn during the war and that he was scared to death during his tour of duty. "We made bomb runs over a great number of German cities. So many planes were shot down and many pilots and crew members lost their lives. I do not know why I was spared. During the height of the war, there were planes taking off and landing in England around the clock. It is a wonder we did not collide with each other."

Shelby said George McGovern a former presidential candidate, and he were in the same training program. He also mentioned that Jimmy Stewart was assigned to one of the squadrons in England. "Jimmy had flown before the war and was anxious to fly missions over Germany. The brass was reluctant to allow a famous person like him to be put at risk He was more valuable as a spokesman for the war effort; but he finally got his wish and was allowed to fly missions."
