



Operation Christmas Child Provides Shoe Box Gifts for World's Needy Children James Walker had the program last week. His guests speakers were Todd

James Walker had the program last week. His guests speakers were Todd and Joy Hanson who direct Operation Christmas Child for Carteret County. Operation Christmas Child is sponsored by the Samaritan organization led by Franklin Graham. The mission of Operation Christmas Child is to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way to needy children around the world, and together with local churches worldwide, to share the Good News of Jesus Christ. The idea is to take an empty shoe box (standard size) or a small plastic container and fill the box with Christmas presents for a child who may not receive a Christmas gift without your help. You can wrap the box (lid separately), but wrapping is not required. Most importantly, you are to pray for the child who will receive your gift. Here are some tips for putting your box together:

1. Use an empty shoe box (standard size, please) or a small plastic container. You can wrap the box (lid separately), but wrapping is not required. Most importantly, pray for the child who will receive your gift.

2. Determine whether your gift will be for a boy or a girl, and the child's age category: 2-4, 5-9, or 10-14. Print the appropriate boy/girl label on the box and place the artwork to the right. Mark the correct age category on the label, and tape the label to the top of your box.

3. Fill the box with a variety of gifts that will bring delight to a child. Use the gift ideas provided on the bottom of this page.

4. Donate \$7 or more for each shoe box you prepare to help cover shipping and other project costs. You can give online by using the EZGIVE option, or you can write a check to Samaritan's Purse (note "OCC" on memo line) and place it in an envelope on top of the gift items inside your box. If you or your family are preparing more than one shoe box, please make one combined donation.






