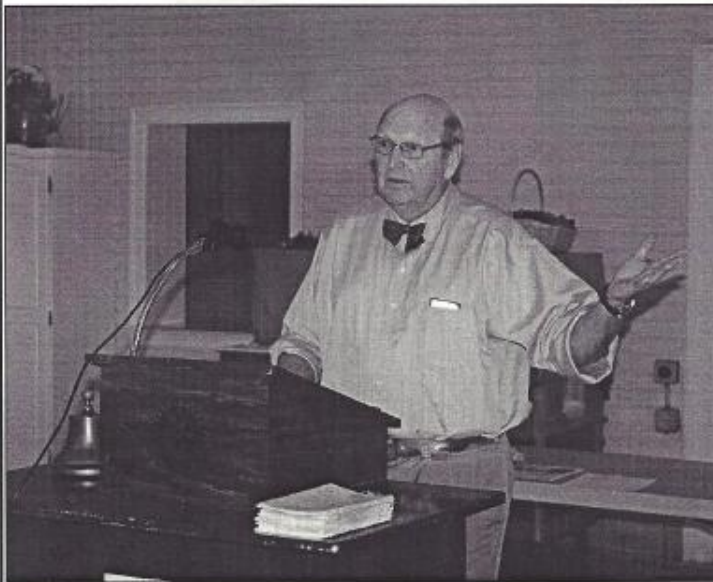

Darden Eure Discusses The New Generations Avenue of Service

Darden Eure Jr. had the program last week. Since it was Club Service Month Darden took the opportunity to bring members up to date on the latest developments in Rotary. Darden said that Rotary International Council on Legislation had approved to add a fifth Avenue of Service called New Generations. The Avenue of New Generations recognizes the positive change implemented by youth and young adults involved in leadership development activities, community and international service projects, and exchange programs that enrich and foster world peace and cultural understanding.

Rotary leadership feels it would be a good idea if we can encourage new innovative ideas in this avenue from rotarians of various clubs. All clubs should be motivated to conduct classes in high schools and colleges in their area to inculcate in students basic moral values and give them awareness of rotary so in future years they become passionate about community service and want to join Rotary.

After a brief New Generations presentation, Darden called on Jim Gregson to give a membership report. Jim reported that three new members had joined the club since the membership drive began.

Following Jim's membership report, Dick Rogers discussed the results of the first yard sale and encouraged all members to donate more items to the second sale to be continued at Shelby Freeman's Garage. Dick also mentioned the Belk Charity Sale that ends November 5.
