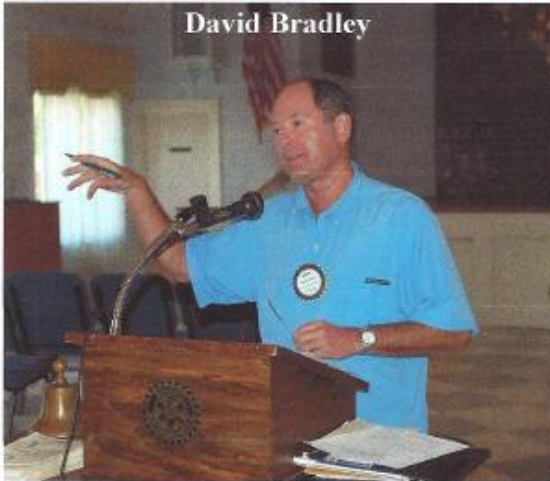

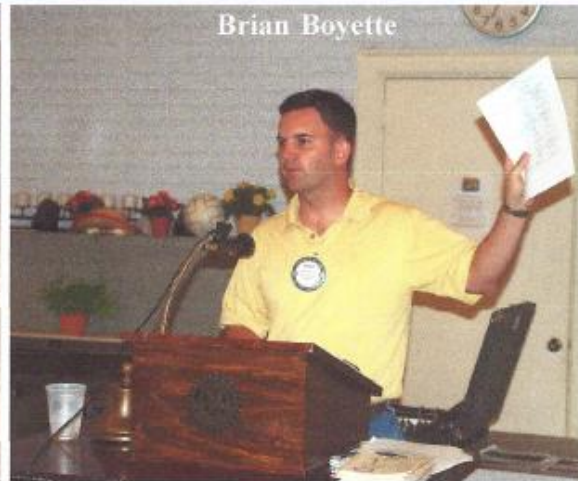

In The Words of Past President James Walker: "The Best Programs Are Presented by Members of Our Own Club."

Programs for the last two weeks were presented by members of our own club. On September 29th Brian Boyette discussed the Rotary Foundation and the benefits we derive from supporting this arm of Rotary International. Speaking of Polio Plus, Brian said that over 2 billion children have received the polio vaccine. The world is now almost completely free of the deadly virus thanks to a grant from the Bill Gates Foundation that was matched by Rotarians. India and Pakistan are the only two countries that still have outbreaks of polio.

Other Rotary Foundation programs that Brian discussed included the Group Study Exchange Program, the Rotary Scholarship program, the Clean Water and Sanitation Program and the Economic and Community Development Program.

David Bradley had the program last week. He spoke on potential international projects as well as an upcoming GSE team that our district will receive from Argentina in April. The team will be composed of young professionals in the medical field. David also discussed a project that Matt Zettle is coordinating that will provide latrines, kitchens and stoves for a village in El Salvador. Our club has agreed to donate \$1,000 to the project.
