

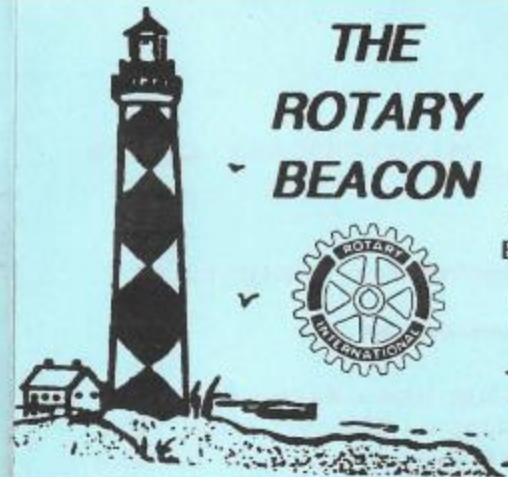
What's the value of one member?
