

Identity Theft a Growing Problem; But You Can Take Steps to Protect Yourself or Minimize Risks

Tom Noe had the program last week. His guest speaker was Sgt. Don Miller of the Morehead City Police Department. Sgt. Miller discussed identity theft and the various ways con artists take advantage of gullible and unsuspecting people.

Sgt. Miller said identify theft is a serious crime. People whose identities have been stolen can spend months or years-and thousands of dollars-cleaning up the mess the thieves have made of a good name and credit record. In the meantime, victims of identity theft may lose job opportunities, be refused loans for education, housing, cars, or even get arrested for crimes they didn't commit. Humiliation, anger, and frustration are among the feelings victims experience as they navigate the process of rescuing their identity. Identity thieves may get personal information by stealing your mail, credit card statements, tax information, or hacking into your computer. They may even rummage through your trash and obtain information for old magazines, cancelled checks, or other discarded personal information.

If you are a victim of identify theft, take the following four steps as soon as possible: place a fraud alert on your credit reports; close accounts that have been tampered with; file a report with your local police; and file a complaint with the federal trade commission.


