

Broad Creek Clinic Serves County's Low-Income Population

Eddie Reed, Executive Director of the Broad Creek Clinic explained how The Broad Street Clinic was founded in 1993 by county physicians and other concerned citizens as a private non-profit, free health clinic serving the adult residents of Carteret County and surrounding areas. Its mission, she said, is to provide access to medical care for the uninsured low-income population in our community. The Clinic was originally based in Beaufort, hence the name. We are now located on North 35th Street in Morehead City, near Carteret Health Care.

The Clinic is open Monday through Thursday. We close on Fridays to keep our electric bill as low as possible. Monday and Tuesday mornings are patient days when volunteer Doctors, Nurse Practitioners, and Nurses work up and see patients. In our "pre COVID" days it was not unusual for seventy patients to be seen on a first come, first served basis between 8:30 and frequently as late as 8 pm each Tuesday.
