

What's the value of one member?

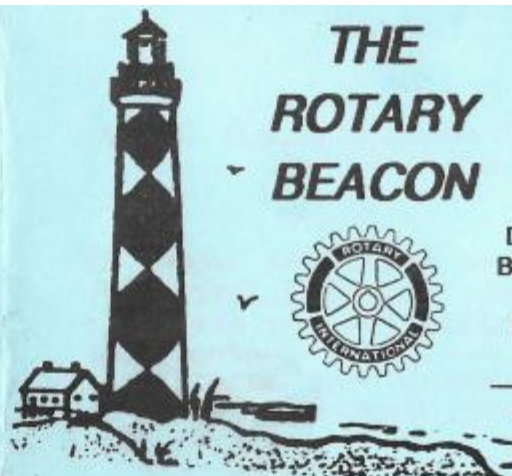
Ten little members standing in a line.
