Last week's guest speaker was Bevin Wall, past district governor and currently a delegate to R.I. for the council on legislation. Bevin said, "The Rotary Foundation contributes resources to polio eradication activities in 122 countries. Rotarians partner with their national ministries of health, international aid organizations, and health providers at the grassroots level in thousands of communities. Educational programs provide services to those individuals who apply for funding and logistical support to undertake a term of study or teaching abroad that is enhanced by becoming involved with Rotary before, during, and after their travel. Educational programs staff, in conjunction with Rotarians, Rotary clubs, and Rotary districts, provide assistance through scholarship, fellowship, and grant processes. The Humanitarian grants program provides grants to Rotary clubs and districts to implement humanitarian projects. There are several grant types that address different service needs and funding options. Our club is eligible for is the Simplified Grant Program. This program requires a 100% match however."

Bevin encouraged club members to make memorial gifts to The Rotary Foundation for a loved one as a meaningful way to honor or memorialize that person. Tribute gifts can be a perfect way to mark a birthday, wedding, or holiday. Benefactor forms are available to anyone who wishes to participate in this latest fund raising program sponsored by Rotary International.

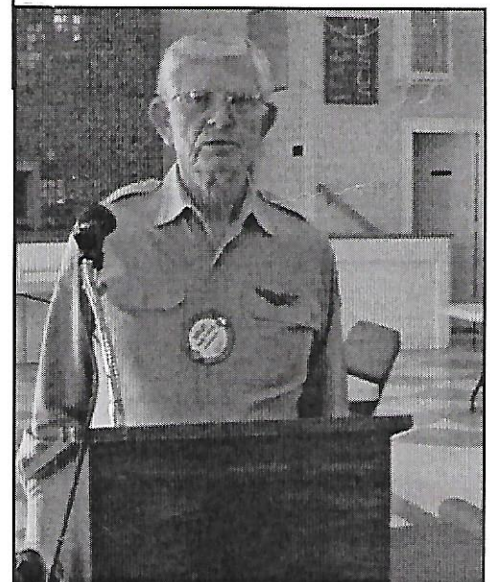

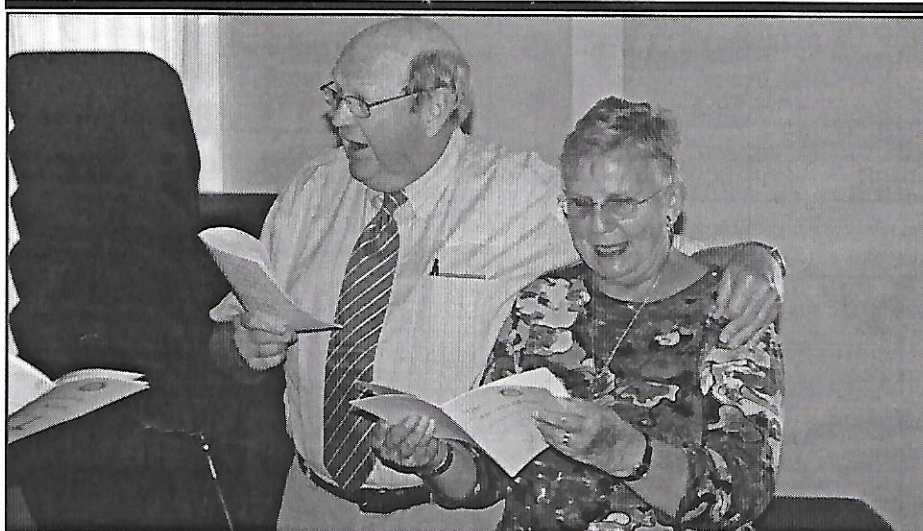
