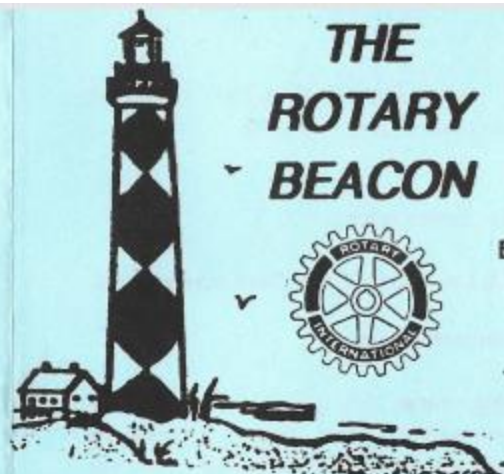
Have we been guilty? Let's find out rather than let anyone feel left out. That is the way strangers become friends. That's the Rotary way.
