

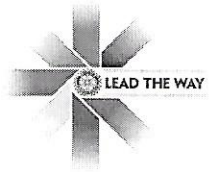

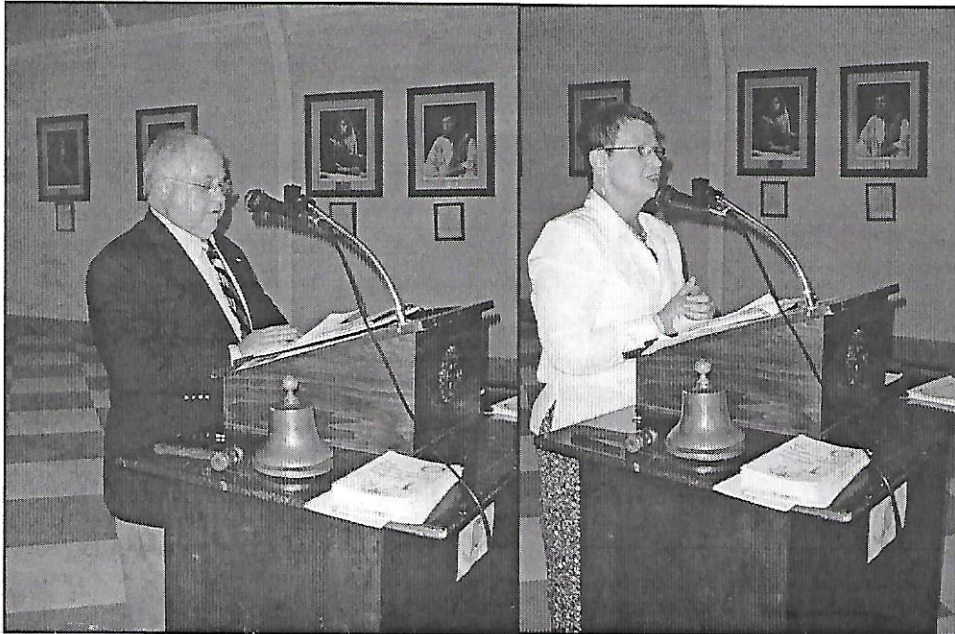

Vernon Hill & Deborah Rice Speak Of Personal Battles with Cancer

In promoting Relay For Life Vernon Hill and Deborah Rice told of their personal battles with cancer and the horrific ordeal both suffered in seeking a cure. "Chemotherapy and radiation treatments are almost as bad as the cancer itself," Venon said. "Only my will to live got me through months of painful treatment." Deborah is an 18 year survivor of cancer...but still lives with it. "Relay for life," said Deborah "is a fun-filled overnight event designed to bring together those who have been touched by cancer in our community. At the event, we celebrate survivorship and raise money to help the American Cancer Society in its mission to save lives . Your help can have a great impact on the success or failure of our efforts."

During the event, scheduled for May 16-17, 2008 at WCHS, teams gather at schools, parks or other sites and take turns walking or running laps. Each team tries to keep at least one team member on the track at all times. But, Relay is much more than a walk around a track. It is a time to remember those lost to cancer and celebrate those who have survived. It is a night for people who

have shared the same experience to comfort and console one another. Relay gives everyone the power to help in the fight against cancer. By joining together as volunteers and donors, our efforts help the Cancer Society strive toward a future where cancer doesn't take the lives of our friends and family.

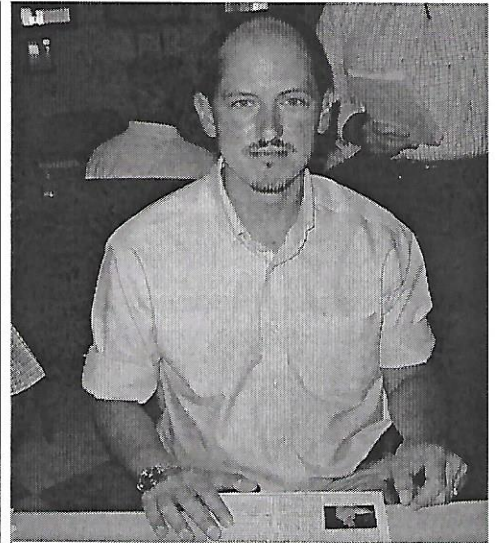
