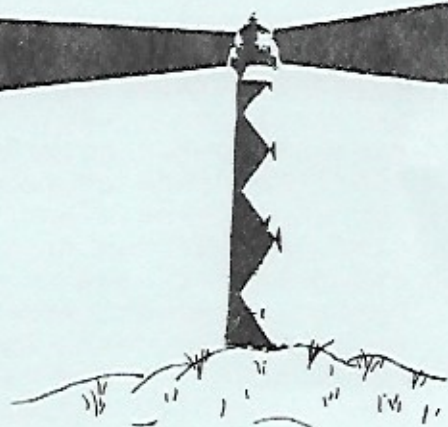

INTERNATIONAL SERVICE

Rotary International defines International Service as "those things that a Rotarian can do to advance international understanding, Goodwill and peace-by getting acquainted with people of other countries-Their culture, customs, accomplishments, aspirations, their problems-through personal contact in the Rotarian's own community, by travel and attendance at conventions, through reading and correspondence, and through co-operation in all club activities that will be helpful to people in other lands."

VOCATIONAL SERVICE

Heretofore, the week including 15 October has been called "Vocational Service Week." The Board of R. I. has now expanded this week to a full month and Rotary Clubs worldwide will be observing "Vocational Service Month" for the first time.

Although R. I.'s new special emphasis months(i.e. Sept-Youth Activities; Oct-Vocational Service and Nov-Rotary Foundation) do not coincide with our program emphasis calendar there is really no conflict, they are all a part of Rotary's overall objectives and in many cases can be combined.

CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING: Perhaps there is no opportunity more worthwhile in Vocational Service than the early training of youth-(the future generation of employees and leaders)-to habits of right thinking and doing. What better accomplishment could our Vocational Service Committee hope to achieve than a thorough job of persuading the young people of our community to use The 4-Way Test?

ROVE

"ROVE is an acronym for Rotary Overseas Vocational Exchange. ROVE offers some enterprising young persons an unusual opportunity to work abroad under the sponsorship of a Rotary Club. The program combines two of Rotary's traditional concerns: (1) increasing international harmony by giving young people a chance to get to know the customs of another country, and (2) concern for youth in the working world. In short, ROVE combines the features of International and Vocational Service. -The transition between YOUTH ACTIVITIES MONTH and VOCATIONAL SERVICE MONTH is the ideal time to sponsor a ROVE candidate." -Clipsheet September '83
